We next heard from our speaker, Lavern Morris of CHKD. She has some open dates in September and October.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PROGRAM ON AUGUST 17, 2021

Kristin introduced our speaker, Lavern Morris from CHKD. She lives in Suffolk and has a passion for racing and fast cars. Her best advice is "Be the solution; not the problem." She started out in her career at EVMS as a librarian for 18 years cataloging books. She next moved on to CHKD and spent 22 years as director in the early childhood center.

She talked about her passion working in the early literacy program and how Reach Out and Read program has led

the way for physicians to prescribe books like they would meds to their patients. She said that this is the leading literacy program in the U.S. They have 6000 sites and over 9 million books are distributed annually.

In 2005 the program came to CHKD and started with basic books. They now serve 32 practices in Hampton Roads, Northern Peninsula into North Carolina.

The practices send in an inventory monthly by category and age and her group fills in the gaps.

The program encourages reading out load to the children as it serves as a way to test if they are building cognitive skills. In October, they formed the first NICU unit and they read a book every four weeks, then change.

Lavern works with a vendor in New York that delivers books for \$2.75 each. She works to find the kids interests and purchases books to fill that need. She spends from \$900 to \$1,000 at each of the practices and works with those practices to be assured that the books are being distributed. For every \$100 she spends with her vendor, she receives 10 free books which she uses to give to the siblings of the patients.

Her organization is funded through grants and donations and has a budget of \$148,000 annually. Definitely the children benefit from this worthwhile program. The book "Positive Ninja" was donated in her name to REACH. Thank you Lavern for such an inspiring message and for all that you do for the children!


