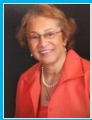

On December 9th, the Prince George County Rotarians were treated to two Zoom presenters; Dr. Eliza Lamb from The Lamb Center for Arts and Healing (Lamb Arts) and Daniel Jones of Jones Foto.

Lamb Arts' mission is to help underserved communities thrive through accessible, high-quality arts programming and mind, body, spirit healing opportunities.

Lamb and Jones shared with us about one of their projects, the Billboard Art Project, that they have been involved in. They chose 7 billboard locations (see map below). In the fall seven artists from the Hopewell area presented their interpretations of the community they love. The project was a city-wide public art exhibition.



Lamb and Jones shared stories of the excitement the art created in the community. The art has been meaningful, touching, rewarding and has been creating ripples in the community. They also encouraged us to mark our calendars for the Hopewell Arts Fest in November.

Other programs of Lamb Arts Center are: Emergency Response, Creative Change Makers-Teen Program, After School Programming, Creative Aging, Pop-Ups and Teacher Training and Support.
