Mable Combo-Farris Commander of American Legion Post 1703 to speak

Sasha Reynolds, Club Youth Services Chair has secured Mable Combo-Farris to be our speaker on Wednesday, January 13. Mable Combo-Farris is married to Verlon Farris, the mother of four, grandmother of four. She is a graduate of Petersburg High School Class of 1981.

She joined the Army as a Food Service Specialist in March 1990 and retired after 21 years as a SFC. Mable Farris has served two years as the 4th District, Department of Virginia Commander. She was the first African American woman to serve in that position. She was also the first female to hold the position of Commander for The American Legion Post 120 in Disputanta. A Post that had been active for 37 years at that time. She served in that position for three consecutive years. She has served in various positions for the American Legion. She was the adjutant for Post 120 for three years prior to becoming the commander. She sis currently the commander of the newly formed American Legion Prince George Post 1703. She is also a Certified Post Service Officer.



As a U.S. Army retired veteran she feels that the voluntary service she performs for the American Legion meets her needs of being productive while also helping other veterans. Knowing what the American Legion stands for and all the services it provides to veterans and the community is what keeps her grounded in the legion. Her wish for the new Post is to always incorporate and concentrate on the Four Pillars of the American Legion.

Those Four Pillars are Veteran s Affairs and Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children and Youth. All the Pillars are important, but for Commander Farris, her passion is children and youth and making sure veterans know their benefits.

Sasha Reynnolds, our club Youth Services Chair, spoke to the Prince George Rotarians and shared a PowerPoint on understanding how our credit score is calculated, the things we do that affect our credit score and her goal to build a better financial future for people in her community. Better scores relieve anxiety, frustration, embarrassment, fear, and confusion. She wanted us to know that the single difference between financial success and financial failure is how well one manages money.

Ms Reynolds lost also shared that 46% of Baby Boomers have less that \$10,000 saved for retirement! She also told us that 40% of millennials spend money they don't have to keep up with "the Joneses"!

I think we have heard a lot about credit scores and how it tells a how mulenderch of a risk we are to paying our bills on time.











Our credit score is calculated by looking at 5 things: Payment history 35% Capacity of Credit Limit Available 3% Length of Credit 15% Number of Inquiries Made 10% Types of Credit 1%
