Our Miles is at CodeRVA

CodeRVA, which started in 2017, is a Richmond City magnet school with a spe-

cialty program in Computer Science. The school uses an open workplace encouraging students to have self directed study, using emails as the main form of communication to send and receive assignments and ask teachers questions. Classroom time is variable, being anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour, with the rest spent in the open space that consists of most of the school. Classwork is done on school assigned laptops using cloud services, allowing students to maintain shared calendars and collaborate in real time with classmates on projects. CodeRVA's curriculum is tiered depending on cumulative grade, with advanced students given the opportunity to graduate with an associate degree in computer science offered with dual-enrollment credits from J. Sargeant Reynolds, while other students have internship positions offered by local Richmond businesses in their senior year, preparing them for the workforce. CodeRVA

has extended transportation for many surrounding counties (Charles City, Chesterfield, Colonial Heights, Cumberland, Dinwiddie, Hanover, Henrico, Hopewell City, New Kent, Petersburg City, Powhatan, Prince George,

Richmond City, and Sussex) with busses sent out early to their district high school. The program acceptance isn't based on grades, rather a representative lottery system eligible to all students aspiring to pursue computer based fields.
