The goal of this program is to assist all students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners by providing them with their own personal dictionary. The dictionaries are a gift to each student to use at school and at home for years to come. Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn, so we encourage our sponsors to give dictionaries each year to children in the third grade.

Our club has participated in the Dictionary Project for two decades. The first year we were only able to give dictionaries to students at two schools: Falmouth and Rocky Run. Since then we have given every third grader in Stafford County Public Schools every year. As reported last week at least one of our past Stafford third graders is now a Stafford teacher.

At last week's meeting PDG Sandy spoke briefly about the International Day of Peace which is observed annually around the world on 21 September. The General Assembly declared this a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, both within and among all nations and peoples.

The theme of the 2018 International Day of Peace was: "The Right to Peace - The

Universal Declaration of Human Rights at 70". The theme celebrates the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights is a milestone document in the history of human rights. Drafted by representatives with different legal and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the world, the Declaration was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in Paris on 10 December 1948 as a common standard of achievement for all peoples and all nations. The Universal Declaration – the most translated document in the world, available in more than 500 languages - is as relevant today as it was on the day that it was adopted.

Because of Rotary's connection to the United Nations from the very beginning of the UN Rotary clubs and districts around the world joined the UN in celebrating the International Day of Peace.
