This Week's Speaker: Greg Riddlemoser



Greg S. Riddlemoser is the Director of Elections and General Registrar for Stafford County, VA and its 140,000 residents. Mr. Riddlemoser is also a member of the US Elections Assistance Commission (EAC) Standards Board and Executive Board, as well as the National Institute of Standards and Technology's (NIST) Technical Guidelines Development Committee (TGDC). EAC is an independent, bipartisan commission charged with developing guidance to meet HAVA requirements.

In addition, Mr. Riddlemoser serves as a subject matter expert and advisor to the Virginia General Assembly and Virginia's Department of Elections & State Board of Elections. Mr. Riddlemoser is a retired United States Air Force Colonel and a Legion of Merit recipient, and previously worked for the Department of Defense in several capacities. Mr. Riddlemoser received his B.A. from Boise State University, his M.A. from Marine Corps University, and his M.S. from the Dwight D. Eisenhower School at National Defense University.
