Dr. Sarah John, Rotary Club of Centreville & Chantilly

Dr. Sarah John - known in District 7610 as "The Haiti Lady" is a member of The Rotary Club of Centreville & Chantilly. She is a practicing emergency physician, has an M.D. from New York Medical College, a B.A. from Brandeis University, Waltham MA. She is also the lead



physician for We Care to Share 100% volunteer medical relief team to Chantal and Canon, Haiti.

In 2016-17, Stafford joined Centreville & nine other clubs to improve a kitchen which lacks basic food safety, hygiene and sanitation. Improvements will prevent disease by preventing food contamination. The existing primitive kitchen will be enclosed, fully screened using the current foundation and roof supports. A sink and modern appliances will be provided.

In 2015-16, Stafford joined with 17 other clubs to renovate a small Haitian mountain village medical dispensary experiencing 12,000 annual patient-visits to provide pediatrics-specific bed space and equipment that will significantly improve the health infrastructure for children in the surrounding mountain region.
