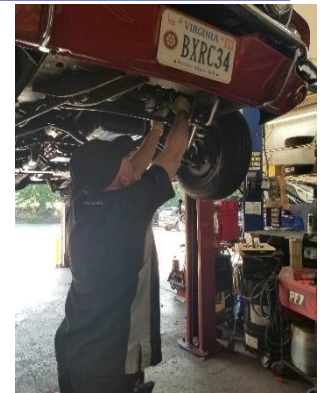


Mustang Update
