The Rotary Club of Ashburn, VA is pleased to welcome Ashburn Magazine Publisher Bruce Potter and Editor Chris Wadsworth as our guest speakers this week.

Ashburn Magazine was started in March 2019 by InsideNoVa/Rappahannock Media LLC as a way to better connect the communities of Ashburn and to help its residents learn more about the people, places and businesses around them.

Publisher Bruce Potter and Editor Chris Wadsworth will talk at the August 22 meeting about their vision for the magazine, the content, and the results so far. Bruce is a media industry veteran with more than 30 years of experience as a local news reporter, editor and publisher. He currently is Chief Operating Officer of Rappahannock Media, as well as being publisher of InsideNoVa.com and Ashburn Magazine.
