Nicole Wittman to Speak

The Rotary Club of Ashburn, VA is pleased to welcome this week's guest speaker, Nicole Wittman, Loudoun County Chief Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney.

Loudoun County Chief Deputy Commonwealth's Attorney Nicole Wittmann has announced her candidacy for the commonwealth's attorney seat.

The Republican hopes to succeed Loudoun County Commonwealth's Attorney James Plowman (R), who was appointed to serve as a 20th Circuit Court judge in February. Leesburg lawyer Buta Biberaj is seeking the Democratic nomination for the constitutional office.

◆ I have been a prosecutor for 25 years and have spent the last 15 years working with Commonwealth's Attorney Jim Plowman to keep families in Loudoun County safe, ◆ Wittmann said in a prepared statement on March 23. ◆ I have spent my entire career protecting women, children and all members of our community from crime and look forward to continuing to serve Loudoun County as the commonwealth's attorney."

Wittmann said she has devoted the majority of her time to prosecuting violent criminals. She also specializes in the prosecution of crimes against women and children, including sex crimes domestic violence, child abuse, child exploitation and cases of child pornography. Wittman has also prosecuted some of Loudoun's most high-profile murder cases, including the case against Braulio Castillo, the Ashburn executive who murdered his wife and then staged it to look like a suicide.

The Republican candidate touted her experience involving highly complex forensic science such as DNA, blood splatter and cell phone tracking evidence.

◆ I have always believed that while there are violent people who need to be kept away from society, the majority of people who offend are involved in the criminal justice system due to addiction, mental health issues or socio-economic issues, ◆ Wittman said.

Wittmann graduated from Mount Holyoke College and received her juris doctorate from Michigan State University College of Law. Wittmann moved to northern Virginia in 1998. She is married to Joseph Langone, who
