District Conference and the Incoming DG

Meet Jimmie, our District Governor as of July 1st. She was introduced in the District Conference, which finished early Saturday afternoon.

The keynote speaker in the conference was Tom Thorfinnson, Chief Strategy Officer for Rotary Inernational. He told us that RI had adopted a seventh area of focus, the environment. Projects to save and improve it are now eligible for matching grants from the Rotary Foundation. He mentioned the growth in hybrid (part virtual and part face-to-face) Rotary clubs and in cause-driven clubs. He said too that COVID-19, disruptive though it is, is showing us opportunities. For example, more than 60,000 people watched part or all of the Rotary International Convention. That's about double the normal attendance. Also, training of the 535 district governors might be done on-line, he said, and, if it is, the savings, mostly in travel cost, will be about \$10 million.



The wonderful **4 Way Test Speech Competition** followed, then a word from our global scholars and then a service to remember Rotarians who had passed on during the past year - our member, **Archie Avedesian** among them. There was a second a keynote speech, by Seth Goldman, awards for exceptional clubs, and remarks by Jimmie Gorski. Outgoing District Governor, **Barton Goldenberg**, was introduced as a Rotarian who sometimes participated in his clubs meetings while riding on a bicycle path. He thanked several members of his team, including our club's **Bob Bokma**, for his work with *Coins for Alzheimer's Research*, CART.

Jimmie will be installed, virtually, as the new District Governor tomorrow (Sunday) from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. The logon information is on the website, rotary7620.org. Let's join in and raise a toast to Jimmie!
