1. Charter Night, a virtual celebration of our club's birthday. Frank and others are planning it for Friday, November 6th. We'll enjoy Zoom networking, a comedian, a guest speaker and wonderful music, all for \$40. Registration will open soon.

2. COVID-19 Relief: Besides donations already made by our foundation, we have \$3,000 more for COVID relief. The plan is to give ten grants of \$300 each to families who need funds immediately for utilities or rent. The operating procedure will be firmed up in a few days.

3. Our president, **Richie**, made a very short video as part of a larger one on **Wells Robertson House**. He was on the program with Mayor Ashman, City Manager Tanisha Briley and other dignitaries.

4. Ken, a member this year of the district's **Polio Plus Committee**, was the speaker in the October 8th meeting of the Rockville Rotary Club. He provided bits of humor and much information as he described ways of meeting the district's goal of \$45 per member donated in Rotary year 2020-2021.

AI and the Emerging World

Our speaker, Dr. Moidin Mohiuddin, had much to say about **Artificial Intelligence** - at least 100 times more than time permitted. He recently retired as Director of the IBM Research Center in California and now is co-founder and Chief Technical Officer of **ScoreData**. It's work is hard to describe briefly. See the details at <https://scoredata.com/> He has known T.O. for a long time and has been a Rotaractor and a **Rotarian**.

Dr. Mohiuddin said much had been done to develop artificial intelligence (AI) in computers, but they were still not good at every task. The term, AI, he said, was coined in 1950 in a project known as the *Dartmouth Workshop*. Other terms, created later, include *Expert Systems*, *Artificial Neural Networks*, and *Deep Learning Networks*.

Moidin told of how IBM's *Watson* beat the **Jeopardy** champion, Ken Jennings, in 2011 and Google's *AlphaGo* beat the world **Go** champion, Ke Jie, in 2017. Computers can accumulate huge amounts of data and, to some extent, learn languages in a natural way. AI has many applications in, for example, banking and financial services, retailing, healthcare, autonomous vehicles, **the space program** and the Military.

Turning to whether computers were now smarter than humans. Dr. Mohiuddin told us of the "Turing Test," named for British mathematician, Alan Turing. It is: *If a human evaluator observing a conversation in typed text between a human and a computer, without knowing who is who, cannot tell the computer from the human, the computer could be said to have passed the test.*

Then, he showed us a number of rational questions, which computers can answer instantly. When he turned to **irrational questions**; however, there was a serious breakdown. Examples are: "How many rainbows does it take to jump from Hawaii to seventeen?" "How many games did the Miami Dolphins win in 2021?" "Which colorless green ideas sleep furiously?" Computers don't answer those well. Our speaker's conclusion was that Artificial Intelligence will not replace human intelligence. I don't know about you, but your editor was happy to hear that.
