What You Missed ...

This week, we learned all about the programs provided by Youth Empowerment Source (YES) from it's Executive Director, Beth Creek. YES is a non-profit agency dedicated to providing support for children and families in Cecil County. Their two avenues of focus are intervention and prevention, equipping youth and families with tools they need to reach successful adulthood. Once you find out all they do, you won't believe it's the only agency of its kind, period!

The *Intervention* arm encompasses programs such as Children of Incarcerated Parents, which uses case management, Life Skills training, and meditation to strengthen families impacted by incarceration. They also work with the incarcerated parents at CCDC to help them learn better parenting skills. The Legacy Program assists youth ages 16-24, who have not graduated from high school, to obtain their GED and gain meaningful employment. Camp ACTIVATE is a free, 5-week program in the summer to teach youngsters to love and embrace learning.

The *Prevention* arm supports the Drug Free Cecil Youth Coalition, where students from all six county high schools learn to interact with their peers to prevent substance abuse.

YES' budget has been severely impacted by COVID-19 and state cutbacks, so they are having several fundraisers over the next few months. Our Rotary club has supported YES in numerous ways in the past, so check out this video to see the latest way you can donate. You can also donate directly through this link.

They are also having another Build-a-Burger night to raise money on April 29th, so mark your calendar!
