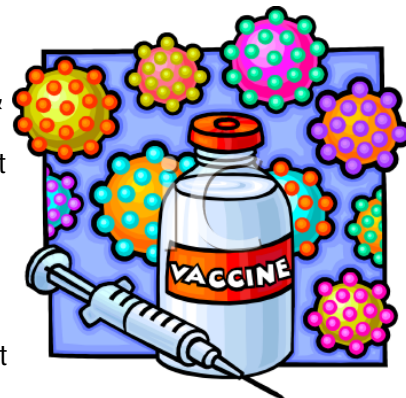

What You Missed ...

This week, Sara spoke about the COVID-19 vaccines. She gave some background information about how the immune system works and what the different types of vaccines are. She then discussed the two vaccines that are currently available, the Moderna and the Pfizer/BioNtech, and the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, which is due to be release any day. Most people have now made the decision whether or not they want the vaccine, but if you still have questions or are skeptical, please reach out for additional help. Most important now, is the information regarding where you can get your vaccine. The Cecil County Health Department is giving 200-500 doses per day, depending on the clinic hours, but the wait to make an appointment is at least 1 month. Local Walgreens, Walmart, and CVS pharmacies have limited doses and are also scheduling appointments, but they have a several month waiting list. Another option is one of the mass vaccination clinics in Baltimore City. Both the Baltimore Convention Center and M&T Bank Stadium are hosting sites, but appointments are still required. If you are 65 years



or older, or have another condition that makes you eligible for the Phase 1c designation, sign up now to minimize wait time. Vaccine supply is still very limited and there is a large population that is currently eligible.

To find the nearest vaccination site or make an appointment, visit covidvax.maryland.gov and enter your zipcode.
