### What You Missed ...

Last week, Mary Anne Risheberger, Program Director for the Monarch Sister Schools Program, joined us to talk about Monarch butterflies and how we can promote their population by planting milkweed. Mary Anne has been a Rotarian for over 20 years and has been involved in planting native plant gardens at schools in Baltimore City and around the country for over 12 years. She helped plant 16 gardens just this year!!



We learned about the life cycle of the Monarch butterfly, how to tell the difference between males and females, and that these butterflies only lay their eggs on and eat 1 plant -- the milkweed. For many reasons, the population has been decreasing over the last 20 years, so we all need to do our part to preserve and protect this pollinator.
