July 2019 Rotary Ramp Build was a Hot One

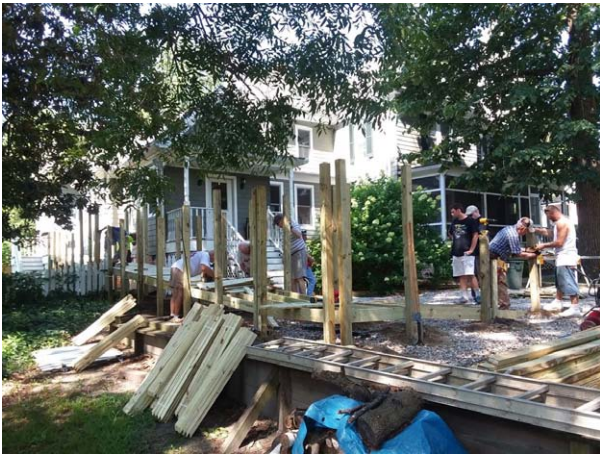


Postmen brag that "Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night" will keep them from their appointed rounds. Not to be out done by the postal service, last week Cambridge Rotarians did not let heat indexes well over 100 degrees keep us from our commitment to build the largest ramp we have ever done.

When the request came in to help the Rideouts by installing a desperately needed ramp, the vote from the Board was unanimous to do the build and Allen Nelson put the wheels in motion to get everything in place. When the planning was all done the date for the build was set for July 19 & 20. Unfortunately, July 19 & 20, 2019 turned out to be a couple of the hottest dates in recent history with heat index over 100 degrees both days. Keeping the safety of members in mind it was decided to start much earlier each day and stop well before noon each day. All members watched out for each other and a lot of water and Gatorade was consumed on site. The team worked together and was very focused over the two days leading up to the build and during the build on Friday and Saturday. As a result, at 10:30 am on the July 20th the only remaining task was to install the handrail.

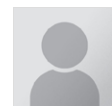

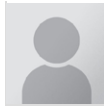
