We had the pleasure of hearing from Kathey Avery who is a Community Nurse for the Asheville area. She has worked for over 30 years as an oncology RN and realized the need of helping people understand about their overall health and how preventative healthcare may benefit them. She has a non-profit called the Institute for Preventive Healthcare & Advocacy which helps to promote optimum health for all residents in Buncombe County by addressing the social determinants of health & the inequities in access to affordable and preventive healthcare.

She & others are passionate about helping and educating people in regards to their overall health. So often, Kathey & her team have encountered how overall social

situations affect people so overall health. More often than not, a physician may tell someone in a medical crisis to do this and do that. How often do we retain those 10 minute conversations? Community nursing helps the most vulnerable citizens by going into their homes and gaining their trust to be able to talk at length of how their overall medical conditions could be improved on. Or simply, to help that person navigate and gain the support they need by being an advocate during the process.

Kathey & her group at Institute for Preventive Healthcare & Advocacy are allies to African-American & Latinx communities across the Western North Carolina region making those daily calls, door-to-door home visits when needed to ensure families have resources available to them. Even such things as nutritious food, housing, transportation, Covid vaccinations and more are part of their service.

# **Update on In-Person Meeting Policy**

A new order from the Buncombe County Board states that "face coverings are required of all Buncombe County citizens, residents and visitors in any indoor spaces in public spaces to

maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others. Indoor public places means ... any indoor place the public is invited or allowed to enter and gather." The order also says, "for restaurants, bars, and other food establishments, this includes that all guests wear face coverings at their tables **unless actively drinking or eating.**"

In order to comply with this order, our club **now requires that all meeting attendees continually wear a face covering** unless actively eating or drinking, regardless of vaccination status.
