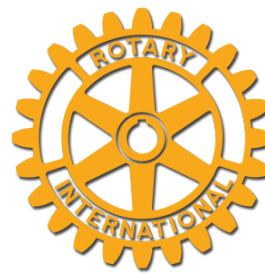

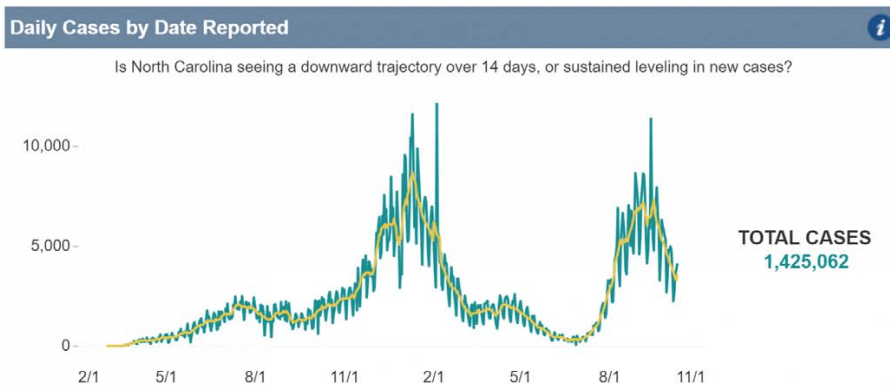

As the chart below shows, the pandemic numbers are definitely headed in the right direction. Following trends seen throughout the world, this latest surge is in a steep decline after ~2 months of sharply increasing case numbers. Our local health care community is still under significant duress as hospitalizations and ICU cases are still high and are more stubborn to subside than the overall case counts. However, the direction is promising.



As such, the board is actively pursuing options for returning to in person meetings. As mentioned at the club assembly last week, our main contact at the Elks Club left his position there and we are using this as an opportunity to revisit our options for meeting together. There are a number of options being considered and I hope to decide on one and put plans in place at the board meeting on Monday, Oct. 11. 

10 Million Meal Challenge Continues

The 10 Million Meal Challenge is still ongoing! For the third year in a row, Zone is collecting data as we continue to spread good throughout our District by feeding our communities. Last year, Zones 33 & 34 collectively provided more than 6 million meals to those in need and well over 250,000 of those meals came from our District!

The process for meal data input is pretty easy. If you haven't already done so, please appoint a Club Meal Challenge Champion and let me know who that person is by name and Club number. After that, it is simply a matter of inputting your Club meal donation numbers (and photos!) into the Zone10 Million Meal Challenge site. That site is just a link away at <https://www.rizones33-34.org/feed10million-initiative/>

For reporting purposes, our District uses a standardized formula: \$1 equals 1 meal; 1Lb of food donated equals one meal; and a standard Chiquita foodstuff box traditionally used by foodbanks equates to 6 meals! For those of you participating in meal preparation with NGOs such as Samaritans Purse, ask them to provide a meal count to you as their formula may differ a bit from ours.

Food insecurity and hunger remain dire issues throughout our District. At my local Foothills Food Hub in Marion, we served 50 or so families per week prior to the covid pandemic. At the height of the pandemic, the Hub was supporting 1,600 families per week and, thankfully, those numbers are slowly decreasing as we emerge from the pandemic.

Rotarians continue to make a difference in caring for those in need. Let's roll up our sleeves and keep at it for the benefit of all concerned!

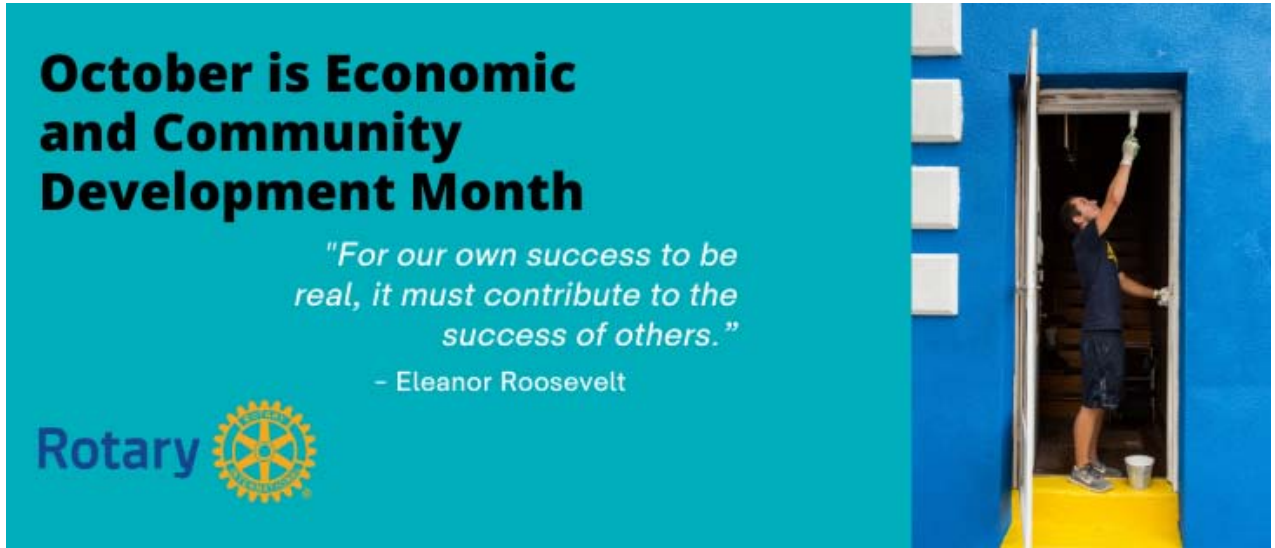
