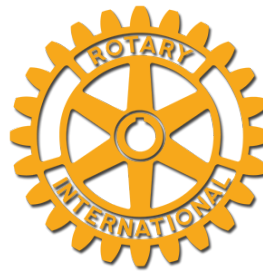

## 10-25-21 President's Update

Things are moving forward to begin in-person meetings at Grace Lutheran Church on November 9. This is going to be a good place for us to meet. The room is large and restrooms are conveniently located just outside of the room. Parking is convenient and plentiful. The church will provide storage for badges, banners, and bell so we won't have to cart things in each week. We will have access to the kitchen for water, ice, and coffee. They have a great setup already in place for audio/visual. They will set up and tear down the tables each week.

Grace Lutheran's COVID policy follows the test positivity rate. When that falls below 5%, they will ease some of their restrictions. Current restrictions require masks when not eating and a maximum of four per table. As mentioned previously, we are currently asking that only vaccinated members attend in person. As conditions improve, the board will determine what the indicator is to open this up to members who have chosen or are unable to be vaccinated.

We are working on a rotation of box lunch providers. We will send out a poll this week to determine who plans to attend in person. Those who want to have a meal will be billed for all of the meals from Nov. 9 through the end of the year with their first quarter statement. We'll adjust the process as we learn what works best.

Some of the board members will participate in our Zoom meeting from the church in our November 2 meeting so we can ensure that we are ready with the technology for a hybrid (virtual and in person) meeting on November 9. We're looking forward to seeing people face-to-face again soon!

## District Foundation Banquet Canceled

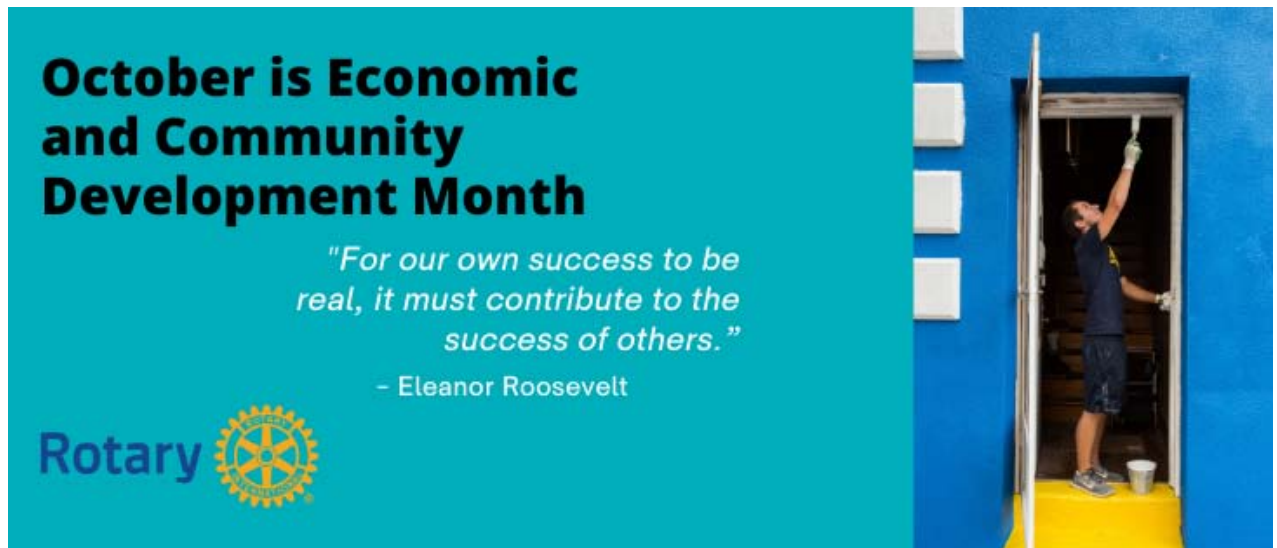
