## Scouts BSA Eagle Scout Certificate

The following is intended as a "How-To" guide for awarding the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians (IFSR) partner certificate for those obtaining the Eagle Rank as a part of the Scouts BSA program in the Boy Scouts of America.

The main steps:

- Join IFSR or obtain assistance from member of IFSR
- Contact local scouting volunteers to gain cooperation
- Fill out certificates obtained from IFSR member and information from scouting volunteer
- Present certificate to Eagle Scout

This guide is designed to raise awareness of and help all districts and clubs to recognize these members of our communities.



As Rotarians, we devote our adult lives to ensuring that we hold Service Above Self, and through our partner organization, the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians (or IFSR for short), we can expand our interests to recognize the achievements of youth who have obtained the prestigious Eagle Scout rank as a part of the Scouts BSA program in the Boy Scouts of America.

For those not familiar with the Eagle Scout rank, this is an award that must be obtained before a youth's 18th birthday. Less than 4% of scouts have obtained this achievement since its creation in 1911. The scout in question must have obtained a minimum of 21 merit badges including those like Citizenship in the Nation, First Aid, and Communications. They must have, over their scouting careers, demonstrated their scouting spirit by living by the Scout Oath and Scout Law. Scouts must demonstrate how they live the Scout Oath by helping other people at all times. The scout must also have planned and carried out a community-wide service project. By the time they are eligible for Eagle Scout, an individual scout must have spent at least 18 hours on service projects not including their own eagle project. Most eagle projects consist of 100 hours or more of service alone, not including the hours spent by other youth and adults.

This award is recognized by dozens of organizations, both private and public, including organizations like the FBI, NASA, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, and all branches of the United States military. We, as Rotary, have a specific partnership organization in the IFSR that allows us to recognize these outstanding youth for their accomplishment and the start of their adult lives as marked men and women.

The following is intended as a "How-To" guide for awarding the International Fellowship of Scouting Rotarians partner certificate. This guide is designed to raise awareness of and help all districts and clubs to recognize these members of our communities.

This award should be presented by an active member of Rotary, whether they have a scouting background or not. It is also recommended that the presenter should have the full support of the club president, youth service chairperson, and local Boy Scout professional/volunteer staff. The presenter may or may not be a member of the IFSR, but someone within the volunteers responsible should be. More information about joining the IFSR can be found [here](#).

If you are reading this EZ-story as a member of Rotary, I would recommend reaching out to your local council's scouting professional to ask for the contact information for the volunteers who oversee Eagle Scout Rank Board of Reviews (BoR). A quick google of your county and Boy Scouts of America should give you the council contacts for your area. The Advancement Chairperson for your local scouting district or council should be a part of the communication chain as well. Many times, this person is responsible for overseeing the Eagle Scout Rank BoRs.

Once you have established contact with the scouting representative, the main idea is to have a Rotary presence at the Eagle Courts of Honor for your local scouts. The IFSR certificate can be presented at the Court of Honor or another time, but it is recommended that we present it formally and publicly at the Court of Honor for greatest impact. This should also have the name of the scout printed on certificate and it should be signed by either the Rotary Club President or Rotary Youth Service Chairperson, if the President is unavailable. Typically BoRs happen several weeks to months before a Court of Honor, so communication is key when scheduling a Rotary member to attend a Court of Honor to present the award.
