Cane Creek Cycling Visit

A special thank you to Cane Creek Cycling Components in Fletcher for inviting us in for a tour this week. They have 42 employees and more than \$10 million in sales worldwide. They are an employee-owned organization that participated in the "Made in Henderson County" program in cooperation with Blue Ridge Community College. The tour was led by employee Andrew Slowey, Manager of Rider Engagement. The company makes top of the line components, mostly for competitive off road mountain biking, stressing quality, light weight and strength. All components are hand assembled, tested, given tracking numbers and sent to upscale bike manufacturers in Germany and other parts of the world. Bikes with the components may retail for up to \$10K, brake calipers may go for \$450, and pedal cranks for \$1000. Their double barrel shock absorbers have been a game changer for the company. They are pressure tested by hand and may be adjusted while riding to fit the terrain. The company aids local riders with support for the Reef Ranch near Dupont State Forest and the Brevard College national champion Cycling Team. For more info see: www.canecreek.com.
