Nov 8-History of Transportation in NC

Tony Mosteller was born and raised in Lincolnton, NC. He is a 1986 graduate of Lincolnton High School and a graduate of the Gaston College Diesel Mechanics Program. He is currently an ASE Master Heavy Truck Certified Diesel Mechanic.

He told us about the 4 different kinds of freight trucks - LTL (less than trailer load) which was founded in NC, Common, Sea/Land Container and Piggy Back (on rails). He shared the oldest trucking company in NC was Frerickson, founded in Charlotte in 1922 and told great stories of various other companies, including Carolina Freight which was founded by C. Grier Beam in Cherryville. Tony now volunteers at the Truck Museum named for Mr. Beam, and shared great stories of the goodwill

done by Mr. Beam over the years. For example, he helped build Gaston College to develop a nursing program, he donated retired trucks to the high school band programs, and provided assistance to many employees for education and health care.

Stan Bumgardner, the curator of the museum, also joined Tony and told many entertaining and informative stories. The C. Grier Beam Museum is now on the National Register of Historic Places and is one of only eight truck museums in the country. It is the only one dedicated to a single company. The museum is open for individual or group tours at no charge.

Tony is also a member of the WNC Passport Rotary Club, and his wife, Tammy, is our District Governor Elect!
