## Public works ribbon cutting

The City of Hendersonville held an open house and ribbon cutting ceremony on August 23, 2019, to celebrate the opening of their new Public Works Maintenance Building. The facility, located on N. Main Street, will house the City's Building and Grounds Maintenance personnel as well as the tools, equipment, mowers and tractors used to keep city-maintained buildings, parks, and green space looking attractive and welcoming.

We are grateful for our partnership with the city's Public Works department on both our annual Arbor Day ceremony and our downtown park on Allen Street.

City Manager John Connet welcomed a large crowd of community members and staff to the Open House, including members of the Four Seasons Rotary Club, as well as contractors and vendors who played a role in bringing the facility to fruition. Public Works Director Tom Wooten and Stormwater Administrator Michael Huffman spoke about the building's purpose and features including stormwater management elements, 1,000 feet of new sidewalk, a pedestrian bridge over Mud Creek and a 4.7-acre pollinator site.

The ceremony concluded with a ribbon cutting facilitated by Bob Williford and the Henderson County Chamber of Commerce.

As you may know, I am proud to advocate for and volunteer with the Special Needs students and adults here in WNC. In an effort to help you make an impact with one of the elementary schools in your community, it is my privilege to provide each Rotary Club in our district with a complimentary copy of [A Pound of Kindness](#), a children's book based on a true story from the childhood of Dave Clark, the only professional baseball player to pitch from crutches.

Many of you had the opportunity to hear Dave, a polio survivor, and his friend Doug Cornfield, at our district training event earlier this year. Doug wrote *A Pound of Kindness* to share with children and parents alike the enduring power of a simple, thoughtful act. What began as a Kickstarter project, is now a children's picture book and a movement to empower children of differing abilities through sports.

This book is a gift from both me and the [Four Seasons Rotary Club](#), and I will be delivering one to each club president during my official visits in September. I will ask the Assistant Governors to help me distribute them to the other clubs this month. All I ask of you is that you donate it to an elementary school in your community to help promote both literacy and disability awareness. *"A child who reads will become an adult who thinks..." - Author Unknown*
