#10MillionMeals

A 2014 survey by Map the Meal Gap revealed approximately 108,000 people in WNC don't have consistent access to three square meals a day. Those people are among us every day, whether we are aware of it or not. People facing hunger are often our co-workers, neighbors and classmates.



This year, Rotary District 7670 is participating in a #10MillionMeals challenge with other districts throughout Zones 33 & 34. We will connect with Manna Foodbank, a member of Feeding America that serves communities across 16 WNC counties, but you may also contribute to local programs in your own community. We are asking all clubs to document their efforts to eliminate hunger using Rotary Club Central and #10MillionMeals. Clubs will be awarded "points" in this challenge for volunteer hours, food donations and dollars donated in support of Feeding America food banks. Phase 1 of this challenge runs January-September 2019, and you can still enter the activities completed by your club earlier this year!

\$1 donated = 4 meal points 1.2 pounds donated = 1 meal point

1 volunteer hour = 10 meal points

Phase 2 of this challenge runs November 2019-September 2020. In November of each year, a Club winner will be recognized in each District and one overall District winner will be recognized in each Zone.

We are excited to announce a 2-week signature food/fund drive competition that will take place September 16-27 to coincide with Feeding America's Hunger Action Month. Would your club please make an effort to document the past activities you have already done and also schedule some activities during this 2-week challenge? Now is the time to plan a food or cash drive for the month of September to help alleviate hunger in WNC. We know you are already doing great things for this area of focus, we just need to make sure we are entering the data into Rotary Club Central so our district will show as an active participant!
