Service Opportunity - People of Action Wanted!

According to recent data from the Alliance for Period Supplies, in North Carolina, 1 in 5 women and girls between the the age of 12 and 44 lives below the Federal Poverty Line. Though these individuals may be receiving SNAP (food stamps) as a supplement to their low wages, they cannot use the SNAP benefits to purchase non-food items, including period products. That's where Project Dignity of WNC, Inc. comes in.

We are a 501(c)3 nonprofit whose purpose is to provide feminine hygiene products to girls and women in Henderson county who are homeless, low-income, or victims of domestic abuse.

Today we serve Henderson, Buncombe, Polk, Transylvania, Rutherford, Madison, Haywood, Yancey, Avery and Mitchell counties. We serve 55 agencies and 148 schools. On a monthly basis we distribute 14,380 tampons, 15,450 pads, and 5,534 liners. We are in many of the counties covered by Rotary 7670. Due to the continually increasing need for products, you can help us have product available through product donations or grants.

How and why I became a Rotarian - Zach Claxton

I took a rather unconventional path into Rotary. Retiring from SunTrust Bank in Atlanta in 2002, my wife and I moved full-time to Highlands in 2004. A longtime friend of mine and former President of the Farmington, Maine Rotary, was concerned that I might not have enough to do in my retirement. In the spring of 1985 he asked me if I had ever considered Rotary. At the time, I knew virtually nothing about the organization. He got my permission to contact our club President to recommend me.

The then President, Selwyn Chalker, asked our Secretary to invite me to a meeting. I went and right away I knew I belonged. That first day I didn the know anyone, but everyone was friendly. As the meeting ended, a Rotarian at

my table told me to come back anytime. Now I m sure he was just being nice, but at the time I didn the know that. I started coming to every meeting, not knowing that I was supposed to come as the guest of a specific Rotarian, and had no idea that I would need a member to sponsor me into the club.

I simply showed up every Tuesday, paid for my lunch, and felt right at home. When the Sergeant-at-Arms called for guests, I would raise my hand and introduce myself. After about three weeks of this, I guess he got tired of recognizing me. He told me that since I was always present, there was no reason to keep calling myself a guest. I suppose no one had the heart to tell me to stop coming.

The first event needing volunteers was the Fourth of July cookout and I signed up. From that point I volunteered for every service opportunity that came up. I soon became friends with many Rotarians. Ignorance is bliss.

After continuing to come every week through the summer and into the fall, one Tuesday, as I signed in as usual as a visitor and paid my lunch money, the Secretary told me that I had been recommended to become a member, and in October, 2005, I became an official Rotarian. The Past President, who had invited me to the first meeting decided to be my sponsor. I suppose the board figured that since they were not going to get rid of me, they might as well invite me to join.

I never aspired to be President, but in late 2019 I was asked to become President Nominee for the 2021-2022 year. Then, at the last minute, the President Elect for the 2020-2021 year had circumstances arise that prevented him from serving, and I was asked if I could move up to take his year. So here I am, loving every minute.

Rotary will continue to evolve, finding new ways to expand membership and service. I suspect we will continue to expand our reach through technology, and will find innovative ways to be more inclusive.

Ten years after joining Rotary she became the first female Governor of District 7770, embracing the

CART Fund as a district wide project and awarding the first CART grant of \$100000. 13 years later she began her term as the first female vice president of Rotary International.

She explained Dr. Volk, who passed away in 2018, was a longtime Hendersonville pediatrician who served as a faithful Rotary member club president. ♦ Dr. Volk dedicated so much of his life to improving the lives of children; we thought new playground equipment was a fitting way to honor his legacy. ♦

The Four Seasons Rotary Club has partnered with the City of Hendersonville Public Works Department and Cunningham Recreation to make the project a reality. Cunningham

crew members conducted the installation and the Public Works
