We enjoyed our weekly meeting #6 of the Rotary year in person at the Indian Trail Town Hall. 13 Rotarians in attendance plus our speaker and his parents were our guests.

Our scheduled speaker was Adam Davis who gave a very interesting presentation of the North Carolina School of Science and Math where he recently graduated. He told us that over 11,000 North Carolina students are graduates including a woman astronaut.

The school is ranked #1 High School in North Carolina with a 7-1 student to teacher ratios. All costs are paid for by the state for this residential school located in Raleigh. Many of the courses are advanced and receive college credits.
