#### Oct 28 - Christopher Lawing - Iconic Signs Charlotte History

As founder of the Charlotte Signs Project, native-Charlottean Christopher Lawing has been photographing, documenting, rescuing, and preserving the Queen City sunique signage since 2010. Christopher found his love for photography and its ability to tell stories while in a darkroom photography class at Myers Park High School in 2010. After polishing his skills and graduating from NC State University, in 2017 he self-published his vibrant coffeetable-style book, Charlotte: The Signs Of The Times. It is now in its 3rd Printing. He can tell you not only the location of almost every iconic sign in Charlotte past and present - but also the stories behind these landmark businesses. Christopher swork has been exhibited at Levine Museum of the New South, Festival In The Park, Matthews ArtFest, and National Scout Jamborees. His photography has also been published in The Charlotte Observer, as well as nationally in PARADE Magazine. So join Christopher as he takes us on a colorful tour of Charlotte s most famous signs. 

The Second Harvest Food & Fund Drive Sept. 15 - Oct. 30 continues, in partnership with the Rotary District 7680 and the Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina, which serves our area. Food insecurity is a constant problem but has only increased with the pandemic and rising food prices. To celebrate Second Harvest Food Bank's 40th anniversary, our goals are: 40 days to fill 4 bins with 400 cans of food and raise \$400 online. As of this week, we are at 66% of the funds goal, with \$262 raised and have filled almost 1 Bin! East Meck's Interact Club will be supporting the effort starting this week. Let's help fight hunger together!

Second Harvest will accept any non-perishables, but no glass. The shopping list below has the most common items most needed. Each time you grocery shop, pick up a couple of cans and bring them to the Club meeting!

There are several locations to drop off food items:


- 3900 Flowerfield Rd. (Georgia's Home- 9am 5pm, 7 days/wk)
