President's Message - October 22, 2020

Dear Hybrid Members of the Rotary Club of Gastonia,

Last week our very own *Locke Bell* gave us some buzz about bees. Locke, a long time bee keeper, shared some interesting insights about bees, most notably how the female bees really rule the roost or hive in the case of bees. The female bees as it turns out, do pretty much all the work, from creating the gueen, caring for the gueen and collecting the honey to feed the hive.

According to Locke, the male bees or drones, after doing their one job of mating with the queen just lay around the house watching the female worker bees buzz about, making sure the hive functions.
