First published in 1956, Proud Shoes is the remarkable true story of slavery, survival, and miscegenation in the South from the pre-Civil War era through the Reconstruction. From the birth of her grandmother, Cornelia Smith, daughter of a slave whose beauty incited the master s sons to near murder to the story of her grandfather Robert Fitzgerald, whose free black father married a white woman in 1840, *Proud Shoes* offers a revealing glimpse of our nation shistory.

The Zoom link will not change unless there is a security reason to do so and you will be notified through the bulletin and the Monday morning meeting reminder.

We generally will not post these meetings on our public website for security reasons. It can always be found in our DACdb portal in the calendar.
