He did lead several programs over the years, including a slide show with pictures of Downtown Durham he had taken and curated showing its growth. Ralph's daughter, Jean, said he was particularly proud to have been part of the panel Dave Ross organized in celebration of our Club's Centennial a few years ago. Ralph is survived by his wife, Lib, his son, Dewitt, and his daughter, Jean. Please keep the family in your thoughts and prayers during this time of loss.

First published in 1956, *Proud Shoes* is the remarkable true story of slavery, survival, and miscegenation in the South from the pre-Civil War era through the Reconstruction. Written by Pauli Murray the legendary civil rights activist and one of the founders of NOW, *Proud Shoes* chronicles the lives of Murray s maternal grandparents. From the birth of her grandmother, Cornelia Smith, daughter of a slave whose beauty incited the master s sons to near murder to the story of her grandfather Robert Fitzgerald, whose free black father married a white woman in 1840, *Proud Shoes* offers a revealing glimpse of our nation s history.

That can be done by highlighting the link, holding down Control and C, and then clicking on your URL/domain box at the top of your browser then Control and V, then hit enter. Macs do the same by using the Command button plus C and V.

The Zoom link will not change unless there is a security reason to do so and you will be notified through the bulletin and the Monday morning meeting reminder.

We generally will not post these meetings on our public website for security reasons. It can always be found in our DACdb portal in the calendar.




