## A Letter From The President

By Emilee J Collins on Friday, October 2, 2020 Dear Rotary Club of Durham,

Congratulations! Your generosity last year to the Second Century Fund has just been used to provide a \$5,000 gift to the Durham Public School Foundation s Accelerating Digital Equity Campaign for the purpose of training and supporting Teachers on best practices of teaching virtually. Online teaching to students who are in a variety of home environments is a real challenge.

This gift brings the total committed spending from the Second Century Fund to over \$15,000 this fiscal year.

I am setting a fundraising goal of \$20,000 for the Second Century Fund in order to replenish and continue to build it up.

Last year our club raised over approximately \$30,000 for the Second Century Fund!

We have also set goals to raise \$60,000 for the Rotary Foundation and \$6,000 for Polio Plus.

Our club positively responded to the NO Bull Campaign funding the Second Century Fund in 2019-2020 and embraced the concept that we support our club selected projects by feeding this larger bucket and not passing the hat for individual requests throughout the year. We supported the Second Century Fund last year, we have funds available this year during a challenging time and we are using them to support important causes in the community.

It is a new Fiscal Year and we have **NEW GOALS**. Consider the ways you can help us reach these goals:

### Rotary International Foundation: \$60,000

Polio: \$6,000

Remember we get the benefit of a 2 for 1 match from The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Your \$1 dollar turns into \$3 for End Polio Now. Talk to Bryan Piccirillo, our Polio Plus Chair for more information.

Other than simply writing checks what creative fundraising ideas do you have? We want to come together in fun ways to achieve our mission. Suggestions have been made for an Auction. From the birth of her grandmother, Cornelia Smith, daughter of a slave whose beauty incited the master s sons to near murder to the story of her grandfather Robert Fitzgerald, whose free black father married a white woman in 1840, *Proud Shoes* offers a revealing glimpse of our nation s history.
