

MEAL DELIVERY:

Eat NC is the organization that connects Durham families who cannot pick up lunches for kids with folks who volunteer to delivery to those families ♠ homes. They need people to deliver meals. Choose the day(s) you can commit ♠ the total route generally takes less than 90 minutes. Apparently, the DPS lunch program is currently distributing an average of 5200 meals per day ♠ they need to serve 8000 meals per day to keep DPS school nutrition employees employed so the delivery of these meals is critical so the food is getting to all those in need.

We have a request from an Occupational Therapist working with the Durham VA Homeless Program to locate a motorized lift chair for a disabled Veteran.

These chairs have a motorized component underneath that elevate the seating surface to assist people with decreased leg strength while standing from the chair. The most famous brand of lift chair is Golden, but any brand would be helpful to this veteran. The main help would be with standing from a seat, as this veteran has difficulty with standing, and thus **has nowhere to sit in his apartment**.


