DUES RESTRUCTURING REMINDER: At the June 2021 Board of Directors meeting, the following changes to RCWR dues were unanimously approved for the Rotary year beginning July 1, 2021:

- 1. Active Members: Dues will increase to \$230 per quarter.
- 2. Rule of 85 and Members on Leaves of Absence: Dues will increase to \$75 per quarter.
- 3. **Members age 35 and under**: will continue to receive a discount of \$100 per quarter for their first year of membership in the Club; and a discount of \$50 per quarter for their second year of membership in the Club.
- 4. Members attending by Zoom: Anyone who is uncomfortable coming back to the Club because of Covid or other health-related reasons must communicate this to Secretary Laurie (lholmesmcd@protonmail.com) and Treasurer Geoff?(gabenson@ncsu.edu) and will pay reduced dues of \$100/quarter. This provision will remain in effect through December 2021, after which time the member and the Board will revisit this special situation. This information will be communicated to members via the weekly email and members will be asked to decide one way or another by deadline July 12, 2021.

*Note: Dues do not include the optional \$25 donation to the Rotary Foundation.

Board discussion: During the entire year of 2020-21, the club met virtually, and dues were reduced to \$100/quarter since no lunch expenses were incurred. Prior to this year, dues had remained at \$204/quarter for many years, which does not fully cover the cost of weekly lunches, district and international dues, or club expenses such as pins, badges and office supplies. Dues for Rule of 85 members and those on Leave of Absence were \$30 per quarter with members paying separately for lunch when they attended. This amount did not cover their expenses. In order to keep the club in good financial standing, several motions were made. Discussion about the motions included the University Club sprice increase for lunches, uncollected dues, and the

need to recruit younger members who may not have financial resources to commit at this time. In addition, discussion included our current situation in which Covid is still a factor for some members. The Club intends to keep using Zoom as a meeting attendance option for the foreseeable future. Members who do not feel comfortable coming to in-person meetings should have an option to pay decreased dues since they are not coming to the Club and eating lunch. If you have any questions or wish to discuss the dues restructuring, please contact President Susan or any member of the Board of Directors.
