### What does Rotary mean to you?

For many of us, the answer is both simple and complex. Fundamentally, it involves connections. Rotary is where I connect with my friends. Rotary is where I ve made connections to grow my consulting business. Rotary allows me to do more, through

the power of Rotarians locally and around the world in partnership with the Rotary Foundation. I turn to Rotarians when I need a resource or a professional service. Rotary is woven throughout my life in amazing ways.



Looking at Rotary from the perspective of **Why am I a** Rotarian? allows us to genuinely share the value of Rotary to prospective members. I hope you li share the joy of being a Rotarian with those in your professional and social circle during Membership Month in

August, and throughout the year. After all, some even call Rotary the &First Social Network! This year, I ve asked clubs to focus on becoming **Bigger \* Better \* Bolder**. To become **Bigger**, we need a consistent, intentional focus on membership growth. I encourage each club to target a

net growth of 5% this year. To achieve a 5% growth typically requires inducting 20% new members to compensate for natural and expected attrition. Over the last couple of years, several clubs in our district have done just that. Perhaps one of the most interesting ways to have significant growth is to establish a satellite club with a different meeting day, time, location or dues structure from the parent club. The district has a goal of establishing at least two satellite clubs this year. Won t you help us identify opportunities for a new satellite club?

How clubs become **Better** can vary widely, but it probably involves learning more about Rotary, enhancing the club s public image, and identifying significant, sustainable projects that address a community need. It can also mean ensuring that you have club activities, programs and projects that engage all your members. Increasing our donations to The Rotary Foundation will allow us to conduct bigger, better, bolder projects in the future. District Rotary Foundation Chair, PDG Newman Aguiar and I have agreed to the following stretch goal for giving to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund in 2019-2020; an increase of just \$25 per capita � 2 dollars a month � for a total giving of \$250 per capita. Won t you help us achieve this goal so we can make an even bigger difference for those depending upon us? Remember too, that District Designated Funds supporting local projects, come from a portion of our giving to the Foundation.

Brainstorming and implementing projects for your club to become **Bolder** can be great fun and deeply rewarding. What more could your club do, and what bigger impact could your club have on your local community, if it partnered with other clubs and The Rotary Foundation on a big project? How many more people could benefit from your efforts if your club developed a big, bold project from concept to completion?

While the value of Rotary membership certainly changes over time, depending on one s stage of life, I encourage all members to tap into the resources offered by Rotary International and District 7710 in 2019-2020.
