This Week... Beau McCaffrey - Lacrosse in the Cape Fear

Retired in 2016 after 27 years with the New Hanover County Schools, Beau McCaffrey's final position was as the district Dropout Prevention Coordinator, where he managed high school Prevention Specialists/Graduation Coaches.

A 1976 B.A. in Psychology, College of Wooster, and a 1983 Master of Recreation Resource Administration, North Carolina State University, Beau was the 1992 NC Governor's Award for Excellence in Education.

He has also sat on various boards and committees:
Communities That Care; Bridging Frameworks for Positive Youth
Development; U. S. Lacrosse, Inc. Diversity & Inclusion Committee; Cape
Fear Coalition for a Drug-Free Tomorrow; Blue Ribbon Commission on
the Prevention of Youth Violence Health and Wellness Committee;
Dropout Prevention Coalition at the Watson College of Education, UNCW;
Lacrosse Foundation, Inc. Board member.

Beau served from 1995 • 2001 as Long-term Suspension Hearing Administrator, and the 1990 • 1994 Hoggard High School Substance Abuse Prevention Specialist. From 1991 • 2008, Beau designed, funded and managed NHCS Middle School Lacrosse, leading to the high school lacrosse programs in New Hanover County Schools that you see today. Beau was elected to the North Carolina Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2014.




