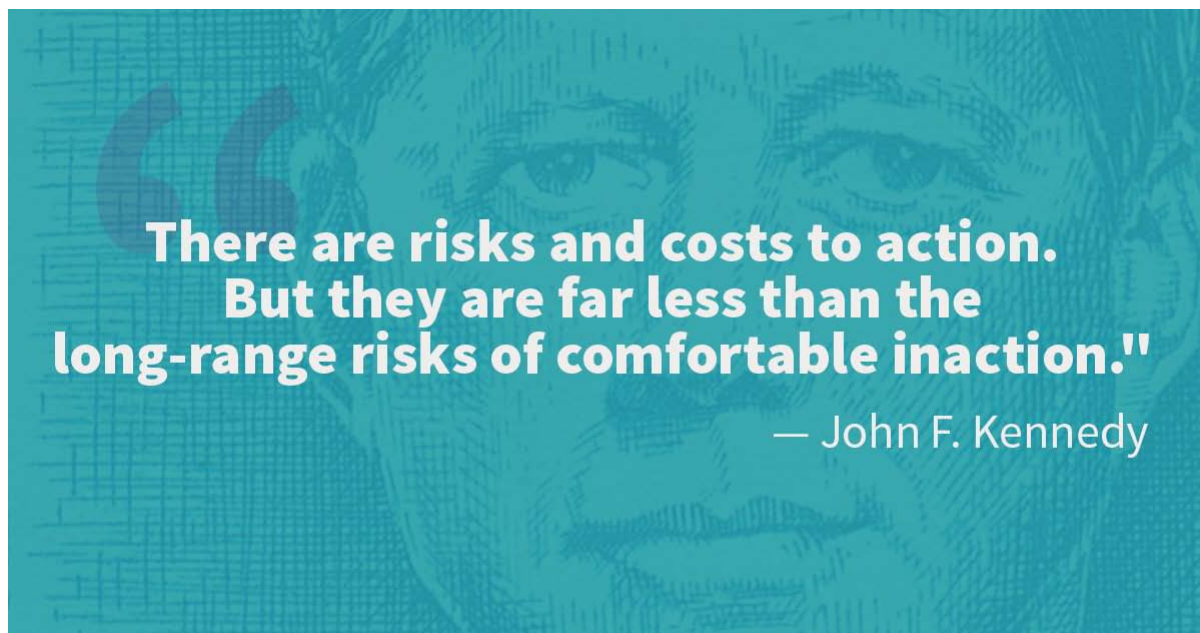

The SBI Student of the Month Project is primarily coordination between the SBI Rotary Club and the West Brunswick High School Senior Counselor. The activities consist of:

- In August, meet the West Brunswick High School Senior Counselor to develop a relationship.
- At the beginning of each month, obtain a Student of the Month's (SOM) name, contact information and biography
- Print the certificate and obtain the \$20 gift card
- Contact the SOM to inform him/her of the award and invite the SOM and his/her family to the next club meetin.

- The SOM and parents are guests of the Service Committee. The SOM and parents are invited to attend the entire meeting. The specific club meeting agenda may have to be arranged so that the presentation is early in the meeting if the student has to return to school for classes.
