Rotary Club honors deputy for tornado rescue

There were few dry eyes when tomado survi-vor Jeanne Glick and her rescuer, Brunswick County Sheriff's Deputy Jodie Mc-Call, were called to the front of the room last Friday night at the Crow Creek club-house.

Members of the South Members of the South Brunswick Islands Rotary Club, who had convened for the June 11 dinner meet-ing, are part of a long civic history of supporting first re-sponders, noted Clint Berry, outgoing club president

This night, he said,
was particularly poignant
because it involved law
enforcement, one officer in
particular — McCall — for
her heroic efforts aiding and
saving Glick in the aftermath of the horrific Feb. 15
tornado that struck her community, Ocean Ridge, killing
Glick's husband, Barry, and
the other residents, Richard
and Phyllis O'Connor.
It also marked the first
time for the two women to
reunite since that treacherous night four months ago.
"It's rare we get this opportunity, but it's even rarer
when we get the opportunity
with some of the people
she's been able to help,"
Berry said.

"It's a little emotional for me," he added. "I wasn't the one there. But the South Brunswick Islands Rotary Club gratefully acknowledg-es the extraordinary efforts of Deputy Jodie McCall and all the members of the Brunswick County Sheriff's Office on the night of Feb. 15, 2021.

"As the tornado wreaked

"As the tornado wreaked havoc on Ocean Ridge Plantation and surrounding areas, we note in particular Jodie's kindness and attention to Jeanne Glick as she struggled to survive the aftermath of the storm," Berry said drawing carelage services and the storm of the storm of the storm."

termath of the storm," Berry said, drawing appleaus and a standing ovation for the two women standing at the front of the room, hands clasped. "We extend our sincere thanks to Jodie and the entire Brunswick County Sheriff's Office," Berry said. "It's such an honor — thank you."

He said the club has a long history of supporting first responders, "those who do, that are living the (Ro-tary) Four-Way Test in their lives and their professions," crediting club members' voluntary efforts.
"But out in the communi-

The community, there are a host of people who choose to do that as a career, all day and every day, and that puts them on a different level," Berry said.
"It makes them accountable.

"It makes them accountable It makes them responsible for so many things." The club has supported Brunswick County's front-line workers through CO-VID, orchestrating benefits for emergency services as a for emergency services as a whole, he said, adding law enforcement is a slightly different niche and level of

"Law enforcement doesn't just respond to help people," Berry said. "They help Berry said. "They help people in every possible situation, not just medical but sometimes dangerous. They're enforcing law; they're enforcing our civil liberties. And the enforcement part of law enforce-ment is considerably more challenging in many ways than other professions. They

protect us, they shield us and they help us. So it's a great honor to be able to support law enforcement as a rule and in general." He said it was also a true honor to have a chance to

recognize McCall along with Glick

According to club membership chairman Ed O'Neill, during that horrible night after the tornado hit, destroying the Glicks' Cam-bria Court home, McCall rescued Jeanne Glick during the ensuing chaos and power outage as emergency crews descended in the dark of night with only their own

lights to guide them.
"(McCall) especially
helped Jeanne Glick get
extricated from the pile of rubble on top of her," he said, anticipating the Rotary meeting would be an emotional reunion as the two met again for the first time since then. He was right.
