SBI Welcomes Kyle Sanders: Deputy Chief of Staff

Kyle Sanders is a senior congressional advisor with eight years of professional advocacy experience providing strategic counsel in the government relations space. Since 2018, Kyle has advised Senator Thom Tillis (R-NC) on economic development and transportation initiatives in North Carolina. In his current role as Deputy Chief of Staff, Kyle is responsible for leading Senator Tillis's economic development, transportation and infrastructure, and disaster recovery portfolios.

Before moving to Washington in 2013, Kyle served as an Assistant District Attorney in his hometown of Fayetteville, North Carolina, where he prosecuted misdemeanor cases in District Court. Following his time in the courtroom, Kyle continued his pursuit of public service and began a career on Capitol Hill. Since arriving in Washington, Kyle has provided counsel to U.S. Representatives John "Judge" Carter (R-TX), Andy Harris (R-MD), and David Rouzer (R-NC). During his tenure in the House of Representatives, Kyle spent more than two years serving Eastern North Carolina by leading Congressman Rouzer's policy team as Legislative Director & Counsel until 2017.

Immediately prior to joining Senator Tillis's staff, Kyle spent time in the private sector providing counsel for an array of non-profit and for-profit clients, as a Principal at a boutique federal government affairs firm in Washington, DC.

In 2005 Kyle graduated with Honors from the University of North Carolina Wilmington earning a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a minor in Philosophy. He obtained his J.D. with honors from Florida Coastal School of Law in 2012, and is licensed to practice in North Carolina and Washington, DC.
