His love for chess has branched out into a volunteer program that teaches chess to students. He started at Southport Elementary for grades 3 through 5 in 2014. A year later branched out to South Brunswick Middle School and then Supply Elementary & Bolivia Elementary. Since he started the program he has recruited volunteers to help run the programs.

Not only are the students excited but parents reach out to him when they run into him in restaurants asking if their child can enroll in the program. He enjoys watching the kids learn chess and actually teaching chess to the other kids.

He was quoted in the article as saying "I thoroughly enjoy seeing how much they are into a classic old game like chess. In this video game world, it's a pleasant Surprise."

Not only does he teach them chess but teaches them algebraic notation to document their play on paper. He said this allows them to replay their games. This makes them think about their next moves. He says they don't even realize they are actually learning if/then statements, one of the building blocks of computer coding.

Meeting Room Fees and Face to Face Meetings

Several club members have inquired if the meeting room portion of the quarterly dues will be refunded since we have not been meeting face to face. The Board has discussed the matter and unanimously agrees that the room rent should be credited. South Brunswick Islands Rotary Board intends to start meeting in person, as soon as possible, and follow all applicable North Carolina regulations. With that said, Tamers is not large enough to host our meeting with the expected phase 3 social distancing requirements of meetings larger than 10. We are in conversations with several nearby locations, such as Seaside United Methodist Church and the Calabash Senior Center.

The board is waiting for firm quotes, which are difficult to estimate, due to the uncertainty of the regulations and location options available. In this situation, if the costs are less than our original budget for the quarter, the funds will be "credited" to the next quarter fees and create a reduction in the next dues billing cycle. If the quotes are more expensive than our current budget, the funds will be "credited" to the new meeting fees and a decision to either reduce in-person meetings or raise the quarterly dues will be made to offset the cost. We will make a final decision in the near future, as we can not move forward until we have received quotes. The board ask for your patience as we await the quotes from the possible site locations.

In all cases, the previously collected but unspent funds will be used as designated for meeting room expenses but I am asking for patience while we obtain quotes, and make future decisions.
