Fayetteville Rotary Club Meeting

Welcome: Past District Governor and Club President Magda Baggett opened this week's Fayetteville Rotary Club (FRC) meeting via Zoom at 1:00 PM, welcoming all to the meeting.

Meeting Prayer and Meal: The meeting invocation was given by Joe Running. There was no meal.

Rotary Song and Rotary Minute: Drew Young gave a Rotary minute covering the object of Rotary: That being, to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise in particular; To encourage and foster the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service; High ethical standards in business & professions; The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life; The advancement of International understanding, goodwill and peace.

Attendance & Guests: There were 15 present for the weekly meeting via zoom, 13 members and 2 guests; Monica Williams from the Care Clinic, and Amanda Bader, guest speaker, of County Solid Waste.

Health and Happiness: Magda Baggett, after the meeting invocation, gave the Secretary the mike for Health and Happiness. Secretary Drew reported that there were no birthdays. Paul Johnson reported that he was prepared to attend President Elect Training 18 through 20 March. Magda Baggett reminded the membership that there are over \$84,000 in scholarship money in the Bill Lowdermilk Scholarship Awards Fund. Applications for the scholarships are being submitted at this time. She also reminded the membership that the Club Golf Tournament will be held on August 17th, 2021 at King's Grant Golf and Country Club. We were also reminded the Christmas Parade is scheduled on Saturday 11 December.

Club Program: Paul Johnson introduced Amanda Bader, from Cumberland County Solid Waste Management. Amanda reminded members that residents live no more than 11 miles from a waste drop off point and that residents pay \$56 annually on their property tax bill for the service. There are also special tipping fees for those bringing large loads of waste to the landfill. There are daily 450 tons of D (Construction) waste, 112 tons of yard waste, 112 tons of container site waste, 30 tons of recycling, and annually 9,000 pounds of hazardous waste. The hazardous waste site at Wilkes Road is open twice a month on the second Saturday from 8 AM to 1 PM, and then 4th Wednesday from 12 to 4 PM. Members were encouraged to participate in picking up 5 pieces of trash each Friday for 5 for Friday.
