He is a facilitator who matches requirements with those who wish to help children. He seeks those who wish to foster children or provide respite care for those who are full time foster parents. Charles also looks for programs that children needing help can benefit from, be it a scholarship, an apprenticeship or another opportunity. He began this work because he realized how many there were in need and how stability, consistency, growth experiences and opportunities could turn around these children's lives and make them productive. He was introduced to Rotary's efforts & the possible opportunities to help.
