- September 3, 2021 - Grant awards will be announced at the Foundation Seminar to be held in Wallace, NC at the Mad Boar. Please check back for link to registration.
- December 3, 2021 - All projects must be started - District will check progress and projects should be cancelled if not started.
- April 1, 2022 - Deadline for completion of District grants and submission of final reports to District


MU Rotaractors collect donations for NC Boys & Girls Country Store

Morehead City Fight Against Alzheimer's Disease

The Rotary Club of Morehead City has joined the fight against Alzheimer's disease--the sixth leading cause of death in the United States. According to recent estimates Alzheimer's ranks as the third leading cause of death. It affects 6% of those who are 60 years or older.

On April 9, 2021, The Rotary Club of Morehead City sponsored Balsam Range, a Blue Grass concert at Glad Tidings Church as a fundraiser for Alzheimer's research which enabled Rotarian Jim Gregson to present a \$12,800.00 check to Rotary's District Governor Dawn Rochelle.

The Rotary Club of Morehead City has given more than \$51,300 to Collaborative Aging Research Technology (CART) Fund to provide grants for cutting edge Alzheimer's disease research. These contributions were from sponsors and gifts from the April 17, 2020, Balsam Range concert (cancelled due to Coronavirus COVID-19) and from sponsors, gifts, and attendees to the Balsam Range concerts March 24, 2018, March 15, 2019, and April 9, 2021, as well as donations from club members.
