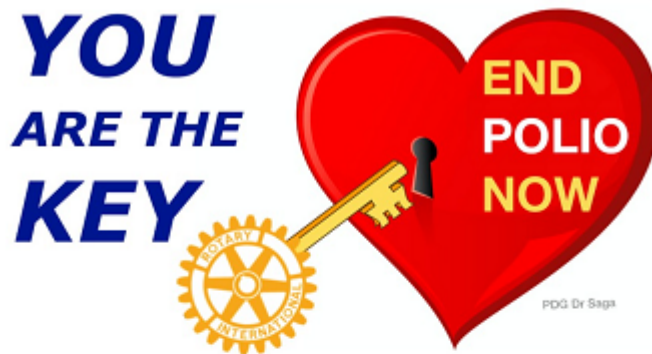

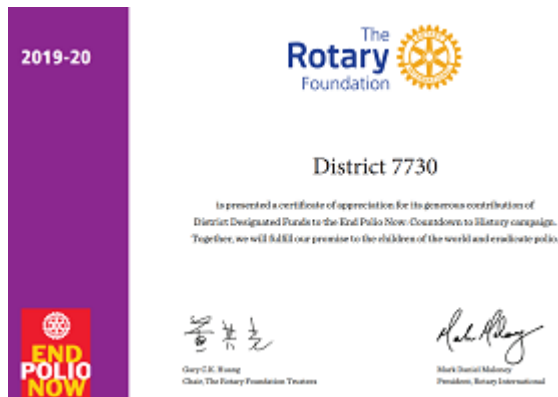
## Polio Contributions in 2019-20

World Polio Day was celebrated last Saturday, October 24. The multi District Telethon was lots of fun with many inspiring Rotary Leaders. Plus we raised lots of money and many tattoos are yet to be applied (you had to be there ??) I hope that listened in, if not a recording is available on the District Facebook page.

Rotary has worked hard worldwide for more than 30 years to end this dreaded disease. Worldwide cases are now about 100 per year in only 2 countries. When we started in the 1980s there were 1,000 cases every day in almost every country on earth. We will conquer this disease but need YOUR help. Please donate now, contributions will be matched by Rotary and by the Bill & Melinda Gates foundation, so a \$ 50.00 gift will become \$ 300.00 to fight Polio.

Our District was awarded special commendation for our efforts fighting Polio last year, see the attached Certificate. Our District gave more than \$ 32,000 to the Polio fight in 2019-20. 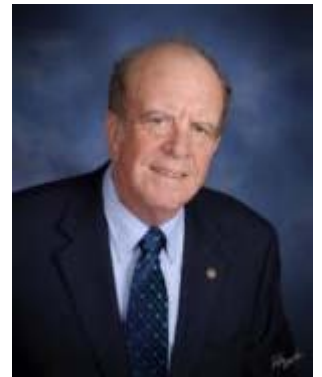
