Zeb is a graduate of Clemson University, having graduated with a BA in International Business and German Language. He is also a graduate of The UCD Michael Smurfit Graduate Business School in Dublin, Ireland, where he received a MSc in Supply Chain Management with an emphasis in supply chain sustainability.

Mr. Parsons has worked extensively in the international supply chain and operations field, with the bulk of his experience stemming from the North American, European and Australasian markets. Mr. Parsons has worked for multinational manufacturing organizations as well as having performed more specialized roles in small to medium size enterprises. His core work focus has consisted of organization and methods analytics, supply chain consulting and continuous improvement strategy/ analytics.

Zeb moved back to his hometown of Greenville, SC, in 2018, to begin his lifelong goal of starting an international, environmental innovation business. His international supply chain background has allowed him to focus, dissect and redesign the process steps found in environmental sectors like the recycling industry. This hard redesign has enabled his business, Bricolage Dynamics, to strip troublesome industries back to their core, allowing the company to rebuild failing models from the ground up. 




