

I could go on about the experiences we shared, the people we met, or the food/climate we experienced; it was a wonderful vocational and cultural experience. This GSE changed my life forever and led me to become a Rotarian. That was 30 years ago, and it took this trip for me to understand what Rotary International was all about.

The organizational chart for Rotary is this: Rotary International is the organization, the club is the member, and we are members of our local club. Rotary is more than you or me. Rotary is more than our local club or community. Rotary is an international organization with 1.2 million members -- WE ARE THE FAMILY OF ROTARY! With a family of 1.2 million people we have different opinions and cultures, with different ways and ideas on how to do things, but we work together for the betterment of our Rotary Family.

This is my Rotary story, what's yours? I want to know, so please email me and share

While I am honored to be your Club President, I look at myself as a cheerleader or a captain of a ship. I want to excite you, to cheer for you, listen to you, and help each of us stay on course. This year I will ask all members to take an active part in our club year: some to share your story, some to share your ideas/guidance, some to get active in a committee. I want this year to be FUN! I want you to have fun, and I want Rotary to change your life like it has mine.

Do you have something for the newsletter? It's so easy to use DACdb to submit a story; just ask Ed Irick who says he can crash DACdb in a skinny minute. He wrote the Duck Derby story all by himself using the **Club ezStory** feature, and you can too!

Check your DACdb dashboard under the "My Club" tab to see if you, too, have Club ezStory and Club ezBulletin icons. If not, you can use the "Settings" cog to add them in. If you do have those icons, you're ready to go.

- Click on Club ezStory
- Click Add Story (upper right hand)
- There are two tabs
 - Information
 - Story Content
- Information tab: type a title in the Story Name field
- Click your cursor into the **Headline** field and it will copy the text from the Story Name field (or you can customize: main idea in Story Name, title of story in Headline)
- Main Story Image: add a picture, if you want, by uploading a file
- Show Story In: check ezBulletin
- Enable comments: recommend keeping that turned off this is on the internet
- Include:

0	check	Include	Separator
0	Rylin	a chack	it if you wa

- **Byline** check it if you want your name on the story (it makes sense if you write it to take credit for it)
- Byline: make sure your name appears from the drop-down list
- Click the Story Content tab (you'll see two word processing boxes) use the top box only; ignore the instructions about summary and content
- Type away
- Click SAVE button (upper right hand) or you'll lose all your hard work
