## LC Sheriff's Office Provides a Wide Array of Services to our Community

Tuesday, August 31, 2021

Holly Furr, Project Coordinator, Lancaster County Sheriffs Office discussed a wide variety of support and outreach programs:

**Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD)** is a pre-booking diversion model that allows officers to divert individuals charged with minor offenses away from prosecution and into community-based services in order to address addiction, mental health, and/or behavioral health conditions. Counselors are also available to assist law enforcement officers with the daily extreme stress of being first responders.

### COAP- Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Program

In 2020 Lancaster County saw 342 overdoses, 49 of them fatal. Through COAP a team of paramedics, law enforcement and a counselor respond to help determine the services the individual needs.
