Indian Land: Past, Present and Future

Tuesday, October 12, 2021



Don Podrebarac, Owner of Southern Spirits and other Indian Land businesses, shared a fascinating perspective on the emergence of Indian Land as a dynamic part of the Greater Charlotte area.

In the midst of the tremendous growth of the Charlotte banking industry in the 1990 \$, one area NOT growing was South Charlotte. That changed with the widening of US Hwy 521 from two to four lanes, and the expansion of area freeways. As the last close-in area that remained to be developed, Charlotte Highway soon went from 6,000 cars a day in the 1990 \$ to its current load of 35-40,000 cars/day.

Don discussed a number of what he views as flaws in the development of Indian Land, particularly in the adoption of the Uniform Development Ordinance in 2016. The lack of consistency in setbacks and building orientation creates

challenges for future development and law enforcement patrolling. He is encouraged that a �small area plan � being considered for the section of 521 between Van Wyck Road and Highway 75 will be more proactive in managing growth in that corridor.

Don also briefly discussed his Spirit of Hope Foundation, which emphasizes ϕ giving a hand UP, not OUT ϕ .

At our regular meeting on November 2, Rotary District 7750 Governor Frank Cox will address our club regarding Rotary International s and our district s goals and objectives, as well as issues that are important to our club and its membership. *Please feel free to invite spouses and guests to attend.*

Frank Cox is a member of the Clemson Sunrise Rotary Club. He graduated from Daniel High School, played football for the Clemson Tigers, and graduated in Chemical Engineering in 1968 and went on active duty in the Army. A 26-year Army career followed, commanding military units from company-sized to a vast Proving Grounds in Dugway, Utah. He served in the Pentagon twice, worked for Colin Powell on the Joint Chiefs of Staff and was the senior chemical officer in the Office of Secretary of Defense. Frank retired in 1994.



After the Army, he worked in Columbus, OH for a research and development company for 13 years; then moved home to Clemson in 2007 and worked for the South Carolina Research Authority in Charleston. He retired again in 2013.

Frank joined his Rotary Club in May 2012 and is currently the Foundation Chair. Frank has been a Club President and an Assistant Governor. He and his wife, Crossie, are Major Donors and Frank is also a Paul Harris Society member. Crossie, is also a Rotarian and past Assistant Governor and Club President. Frank and Crossie have been married over 51 years with 2 wonderful children and 4 mischievous grandchildren who, according to Frank, take after their grandmother.
