Do you have questions about the newly established RCHHI Charitable Fund? Robert Eberly III and Karen Cully have provided some of the frequently asked questions along with answers. Each week we will feature a new question.

- When we instituted a new dues structure last year, with the fact that everyone would pay that amount even if they were on a leave of absence, attending meetings, or under any other special dues structure, we were told the funds would be used to cover all the activities, donations, and other expenses (including things like Safety Town, Happy Feet, Teacher Appreciation, etc.). Now we're being told that the Foundation was established to cover the same things, but we haven't reduced the dues. Are we going to split off some of the quarterly invoiced amount and put it in the Foundation? (Oh Karen...say it isn't so!!!)
 - This is inaccurate. When we instituted the new dues structure, our first aim was to increase transparency and fairness to all concerned. To that end, we articulated the difference between Club operating costs which are covered by member dues, and community projects/ charitable efforts which are funded through our fundraising efforts (both internal to the club, and external - within the community). To this end, member dues will not change as a result of the creation of the Charitable Foundation.

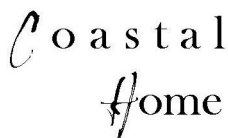
