 - This is a fiduciary decision that will be made by the Charitable Foundation's Board when such a need arises. It is their duty to oversee this process as is the case for any Foundation.

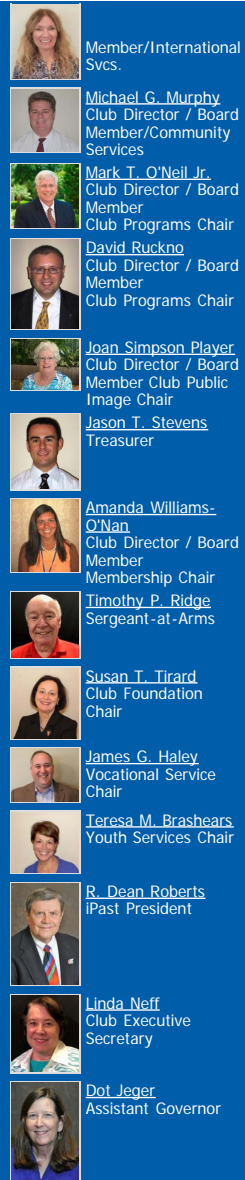
This Day in History

November 4, 1979: At the American Embassy in Teheran, Iran, 90 people, including 63 American citizens, were taken hostage by militant student followers of the Ayatollah Khomeini. The students demanded the return of the deposed Shah of Iran, Reza Pahlavi, who was undergoing medical treatment in New York City.

Born on this Date: In 1916, Ruth Handler, business woman and toy designer who, together with her husband, founded the Mattel Company and created the iconic Barbie Doll.

50 Things Every Rotarian Should Know About Rotary

First Names: From the earliest days of Rotary, members have referred to each other on a first-name basis. Since personal acquaintanceship and friendship are cornerstones of Rotary, it was natural that many clubs adopted the practice of setting aside formal titles in conversations among members. Individuals who would normally be addressed as Doctor, Professor, Mr., Mrs., Ms. or Sir/Madam are regularly called Mary, Robin, Andrea, Bob, Joe, or Bruce by other Rotarians. The characteristic Rotary club name badge fosters the use of first names. In some Asian countries, it is common to assign a new member a nickname which relates to a personal characteristic or is descriptive of the new member's business or profession. For example, the nickname "Trees" was given to a Rotarian who was in the lumber business. The nicknames are a source of good-natured fun and fellowship. But whether a Rotarian is addressed by his or her first name or by a nickname, the spirit of personal friendship is the initial step that opens the door to all other opportunities for service.
