November and December - Matching Points for The Rotary Foundation

It's that time of the year for District 7770 to offer Matching Points for your cash contributions to The Rotary Foundation. This District Matching Point Campaign is for the months of November and December. At our club meeting last week, PDG, David Tirard shared the many ways Rotary is impacting lives around the world as Rotary International continues to invest in life changing projects. David shared some of the many ways the Rotary Foundation is "Doing Good in the World!" However, your continued support is necessary to keep up with the increasing demands.

For every dollar- \$100-\$500 you contribute towards your Paul Harris Fellow level, the District will match your contribution with the same number of points. For example: if you are \$200 away from your next Paul Harris Fellow level, a cash contribution in November or December of only \$100 cash will allow for a match of \$100 points from the District and you will fulfill your commitment to the next PHF level. You will then be recognized with a Paul Harris Fellow pin.

In order to make sure there is no confusion between Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) and Paul Harris Society (PHS), PHF levels may be achieved by both cash and points. PHS is a commitment to contribute \$1,000 cash per year. This PHS cash contribution will do two things; it will increase your levels of PHF and recognition level and also contribute towards your Major Donor status. Once you reach \$10,000 cash contributions you become a Major Donor Level 1.

The Matching Points Campaign ends December 31, 2021, however, if you would like to participate, please let me know at susantirard@gmail.com. We need to provide to Rotary International the following information to ensure that your contribution receives the proper recognition and you also receive the Matching Points from the District. I will collect all checks and send them to Rotary International with the appropriate paperwork.

1. Make checks payable to The Rotary Foundation.

2. Member's Rotary ID number somewhere on the check to insure the member receives proper credit. (I will include if you do not know your number).

3. All checks must be to me, no later than December 20, 2021. Rotary and The District will not accept checks for this program after December 31, 2021. Either give me your check at the club meeting or mail it to me at 1 Queen Crescent, Bluffton SC 29910.

If you would like to know your point balance or have other questions, please let me know and I will be happy to discuss them with you.
